Course Description

This first-semester Dutch course emphasizes vocabulary building, grammar, and listening comprehension as a solid foundation for overall linguistic proficiency in Dutch. The course will also provide insight into the culture of the Low Countries.

Required work

- Practice/participation in class: it is impossible to learn a language without trying and making mistakes. The language classroom offers an opportunity to practice integrating listening, speaking, reading and writing under close supervision, with the help of classmates. In a non-Dutch environment, the classroom setting is as close students can get to native-speaker exposure.
- Homework: exercises, preparation for classroom activities.
- Tests, a Midterm (Tuesday October 15), and a Final (December 10).

Calculation final grade
