3. **Financial Insights:** Visit the Nederlandsche Bank, the Dutch central bank (virtually), to gain valuable insights into European central banking practices and their impact on the global economy.
4. **Educational Contrasts:** Compare and contrast the American and Dutch educational systems, highlighting the differences in teaching, student experiences, and societal values.

**In-Class Discussions:** Engage in lively discussions on a range of topics including Dutch policies on finance, education, art, health, and crime. Through visual material, texts, and online resources, participants will gather the necessary information to contribute meaningfully to these interchanges.

**Culminating Essay:** Cap off the seminar with an essay that addresses the overarching question: What does Amsterdam's 750-year history reveal about its cultural and societal landscape? You will draw upon your take-aways from the course to craft a well-informed paper.

**Language of Instruction:** All readings, lectures, and discussions will be conducted in English.
