Course description

Italian 0200, or Elementary Italian II, is a second semester continuation of our introductory Elementary Italian I course. Classes are conducted in Italian and emphasize the development of communicative skills and conversational competence. Throughout the semester, learners will develop cross-cultural, listening, reading, writing, and speaking skills. Learners will engage in meaningful tasks and interactive activities, inside and outside the classroom. Students will be exposed to authentic cultural materials, such as films, video clips, songs, and literature. Classwork will be supplemented with homework, and with accompanying assignments provided by the instructor. Students will have abundant opportunities to speak together as a class, in pairs, small groups, and with the instructor. **Students who have previously studied Italian are required to take the Placement Test.**

Prerequisites:

- Successful completion of ITAL 0100
- A score between 390 and 440 on the SAT II or the departmental written exam

Class Structure

- Students will attend classes MTWR 10:15-11:15 am
- Students will complete out-of-class assignments as indicated by the instructor (in Canvas and Blink Learning)
- Students' progress will be evaluated through a combination of low-stake and high-stake assessments (in-class tasks, compositions, forums discussions, written and oral exams, individual and collaborative presentations and projects)

- Weekly forum discussion on Canvas
- Weekly Video/Voice recordings
- Daily assignments (exercises in the workbook/Blink Learning, handouts, compositions, videos, research, mini presentations)
