Course ID and 6-digit Number: JPAN0500-001 (formerly JPAN211)

Course Description and Level:

Intermediate course with prerequisite of Beginning Japanese course, JPAN112, JPAN022 or equivalent. The goal of this course is to communicate more in detail and at greater length about various topics with and understanding of pragmatic, sociolinguistic, and cultural aspects in Japanese contexts. This course also focuses on the further development of the four language skills (speaking, listening, writing, and reading).

Class Structure for Fall 2022

In-Person Sessions Planned

- Four in-person classes each week from Monday to Thursday (1 hour each)
- Quizzes, unit exams, oral presentation, and final oral exam will be conducted during in-person classes.

Out-of-class Activities

- Read textbook
- Homework: workbook, preparation assignment,
- Essay assignment (2-3 times per semester)
- Work on a project

Schedule reflecting the workload for a typical week

Estimated total workload: 10 hours per week including class time

Monday through Thursday (total workload: 7.5h/w)

- Attend in-person classes (4h/w)
- Read the assigned readings, work on daily homework and study for in-class quiz (3.5h/w)

Friday through Sunday (total workload: 2.5h/w)

- Read the assigned readings, work on daily homework and study for in-class quiz or unit exam for next week (1.5h/w)
- Work on a project (1h/w)
