### Course Description and Level

KORN 0220 is designed for heritage speakers who have previous knowledge in everyday Korean. This course aims to enhance linguistic accuracy (spelling, grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation) and fluency (conversation skills, narrative structure, discursive practice) in both spoken and written Korean. This course also focuses on the development of intercultural competence through discussions of prevalent cultural practices in Korean. Upon completion of the course, students will be able to express themselves more accurately and confidently and participate in Korea-related communities in a more meaningful way.

### Oral Performances

- There will be four individual/group mini-presentations, two class discussions, one oral interview, and one final project.
- **Mini Presentations:** You will give an individual/group presentation on a given topic. More details will be announced later.
- **Class Discussions:** There will be two class discussions on a given topic. More details will be announced later.
- **Oral Interview:** There will be an oral interview at the end of the semester. More details will be announced later.
- **Final Project:** 3-4 students will form a group and create a video. More details will be announced later.

- The final exam (written exam) is cumulative and will cover all the contents covered in class.
