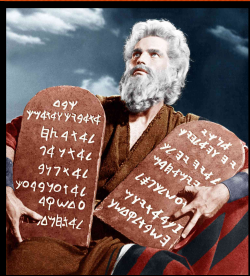

Course Description

For a purportedly boring book filled with old fashioned ideas, the Bible sure spends a lot of time talking about political intrigue, murder, incest, magic, and ghosts. When we put the Bible back into the ancient Middle Eastern context that produced it, we find stories that could fill any number of HBO series explicit enough to make most modern audiences blush. Have you heard the one about the last princess from a murdered royal family taking over Jerusalem? Did you know about the prophet Elisha's uncanny ability to summon bears, or King David's army of undead? This course will challenge students to take a fresh look at some of the Hebrew Bible's most familiar passages and to engage with some of its most overlooked ones.
