Intermediate Italian I

Course ID and 7-digit Number: ITAL 0300-303

Course Description

ITAL 0300, or Intermediate Italian I, is the first half of a two-semester sequence designed to help students attain a level of proficiency that will allow them to function comfortably in an Italian-speaking environment. The course will build on students' existing skills in Italian, increase their confidence and their ability to read, write, speak, and understand the language, and introduce students to more refined lexical items, more complex grammatical structures, and more challenging course material. This course is organized around content-based modules that will allow students to explore culturally relevant topics and to develop cross-cultural skills through the exploration of similarities and differences between students' native culture and the Italian world. Classes will be conducted entirely in Italian. Attendance and participation in Italian is of the utmost importance because students will work collaboratively with their classmates and the instructor towards increased linguistic competence and a more complex understanding of Italian culture.

Prerequisites:

- Completion of Italian 0200
- A placement score between 450 and 540 on the SAT II or the departmental placement exam.

Class Structure for Fall 2022

- In-Person Sessions Planned
- Students will attend classes MWF 3:30-4:30 pm
- Asynchronous work may occasionally be assigned
- Students will complete out-of-class assignments as indicated by the instructor
