From the approximately 1st century CE until the 12th century (and beyond) “classical Sanskrit” was an important language in South Asia for the erudite discussion of politics, literature, religion, and sciences.

This course introduces students to the fundamentals of Sanskrit grammar. In this comprehensive course, students will acquire a working knowledge of Sanskrit grammar, syntax, and essential vocabulary. At the end of First Year Sanskrit, Parts I & II, students will be ready to start reading original Sanskrit texts with instructor guidance.
