### Course ID: SPAN 1000

**Course Description and Level:** Advanced Spanish Language Course. This course is designed to develop students' communicative abilities in Spanish as well as their knowledge of Hispanic cultures and societies. Students practice communication through speaking, listening, reading, and writing. All activities are highly interactive and focus mainly on speaking and listening. Students **must have fulfilled the language requirement** in order to enroll in this course.

### Class Structure for Spring 2023

- For the Spring 2023 semester, we are planning for all sections of SPAN 1000 to be taught in-person. All sections are scheduled to meet three times per week for 60 minutes per class. All classes will be taught in Spanish.
- All activities will be highly interactive and in consonance with the conversational nature of the course.
- The due dates for assignments and exams will be detailed in the course syllabus.

- Prior to every in-person meeting, students will complete homework assignments located on MindTap, Canvas or the course e-book.
