Course Description

Through close readings of primary and secondary sources, this course will explore the concerns that motivated Jews to write works of history; Jewish beliefs about the meaning of history -shaped, at times, by messianic expectations and/or a sense of Jewish exceptionalism- and Jewish periodizations of their own history. Attention will be paid to the temporal and cultural factors that shaped individual sources in Roman, Islamic and Christian lands and under the sway of ideologies like Hegelianism and Zionism. What are the boundaries between memoir, journalism and historiography? Selections range chronologically from the Hebrew Bible through 20th and 21st century historiographies of the Holocaust, the 6 Day War and the 1973 Yom Kippur War. Capstone project: Create two distinct documentary perspectives – in writing or in film-- on a current or recent event/development that affects the lives of Jews.

Requirements & Breakdown of Grading:

- (a) Regular attendance and active participation in class discussions. **25%**
- (b) Orally present 2 written questions/comments "interrogating" the sources in 10 classes. **25%**
- (c) **Session 8:** Class discussion on the changing meanings of events in ancient Jewish history. **7.5%**
- (d) Due **Session 11 (10/20):** 5-7 page on Israeli 10 part mini-series, "Our Boys" [*"Ha-Nea'rim"*], **OR** "Image of Victory". **OR** "Fires in the Mirror". Prompt to be distributed on Oct. 9th. **15%**
- (e) **Session 15: Class Discussion:** Compare & contrast Crusade Chronicle & Abyss of Despair. **7.5%**
- (f) **Sessions 24-25:** Presentations of student work capturing two documentary perspectives on a single event or development that affects the lives of Jews. **20%**

Preparing for Class:

PRINT the sources prior to each class. (6 pages per side is fine, if you can still read it!) **Make sure you have access to a working printer.**

READ the italicized questions and let them guide your reading.

ANNOTATE the sources with your comments and questions.
